St. Michael's started our Laundry Love Ministry on July 12, 2021. Every Monday from 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM a group of parishioners provides free laundry services at the West Side Laundry and Dry Cleaning, located at 2323 W. Colorado Ave. I'm grateful for everyone who has prayed for our ministry, those who have donated quarters, and especially all who have volunteered to be at the laundromat.



Every Monday I receive countless thanks and words of appreciation for our ministry. You can only imagine how a person feels and how their self-esteem is lifted by just having clean clothes. Between July 12 and November 1, St. Michael's has provided the financial support to wash and dry 720 loads of laundry and we have served 313 guests and spent \$1,842 in quarters donated by you!

Thanks again for the love everyone has provided in every way to make this ministry a success. We will continue to provide this ministry every Monday to our siblings in Christ who are less fortunate than we are. These two ministries are an opportunity for those of us privileged to live in freedom to be the Church inside the prison and encourage the incarcerated to choose to Live in Christ, loved and forgiven. As we rebuild our presence inside the facilities, we will prepare to hold the 4-day weekends that draw new participants into the family of God in 2022. Volunteers from St. Michael's serve in Territorial Correctional Facility, Denver Women's Correctional Facility, LaVista Women's Correctional Facility, and the Youthful Offender System prison in Pueblo. Music Notes

"Music gives a soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination and life to everything." – Plato

I am writing this while sitting on top of a mountain, looking up at Pikes Peak and down into Cheyenne Canyon. I've just returned from a church leader's retreat called "Manna in the Wilderness." I look around me and feel a deep peace in the cradle of God's creation. The foothills gently slope, America's mountain, dusted with snow, looms invitingly. Just out of reach a faint crescent moon hangs in the bright blue sky. A hymn comes to mind as I am surrounded by God's presence:



"For the beauty of the earth, for the glory of the skies, for the love which from our birth over and around us lies, Lord of all, to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise."

In this time of Thanksgiving I begin to count my blessings. The metaphorical wilderness that surrounds me has at times felt like a vast wasteland or an expansive mountainscape or a dark canyon or a white sandy beach. It has been unfamiliar, yet beautiful; difficult to navigate, yet enticing. I have had to face my greatest hopes and my greatest fears. Where is the manna? Is it a comforting home? A friend or family member? A ritual or prayer? A wise colleague recently said "the sustenance that's coming to us may be something completely new, something that we're not used to."

As we move into Advent, a time of waiting and hoping, my prayer is that you find the manna to sustain you through the dark times that come before the light.
