As a bridge between Christmas and Lent, a season of epiphanies prepare us to repent. The unfolding of God's love invites, new realities and promises, following the light.



In the coming weeks, we will hear stories of Jesus' baptism, the calling of disciples, and miracles. As you hear these stories again, I'd encourage you to listen with a renewed sense of curiosity and seek out new learnings, new possibilities, and new promises.

But don't get too comfortable during Epiphany. With an early Easter this year, we will begin our journey through the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14. We have numerous exciting opportunities for you to explore, grow, and deepen your faith in 2024. See you on Sunday!

The Rev. Becca Stevens Sunday, February 25

THISTLE FARMS

We are thrilled to welcome The Rev. Becca Stevens to St. Michael's on Sunday, February 25. Becca Stevens is a nonprofit leader, entrepreneur, priest, survivor, and founder and President of Thistle Farms, an organization dedicated to healing, empowering, and employing female survivors of human trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. She has founded 13 nonprofits and justice enterprises, mentored another 70, and has raised over \$75 million to support them. Becca has authored 12 books and sold over

300,000 copies. She has served as chaplain at St. Augustine's Chapel on Vanderbilt's campus for almost 30 years. Becca has been featured on PBS NewsHour, The Today Show, CNN, ABC World News, named a CNN Hero, a White House Champion of Change, and holds five honorary doctorates. Drawn from 25 years of leadership in mission-driven work, Becca leads important conversations across the country with an inspiring message that love is the strongest force for change in the world.

On February 25, we will also bless a special chalice and paten that was part of The Bethlehem Project. Born between Thistle Farms, Love Welcomes, and the Center for Contemplative Justice, only 300 chalices and patens were commissioned from four displaced women potters living in Bethlehem in the West Bank. The miracle of these vessels is that they were received the week prior to Hamas' attack on October 7, 2023. Now we cherish these as a remnant of a peace that passes understanding. We hold them and pray that love remains a powerful force for change. They call us to cherish the gift of life.


Sacred Land Tuesdays, 6:30 - 8:30 PM

Lenten Retreat: An Invitation to a Holy Lent Saturday, February 10, 8:30 AM - 2:30 PM (Lunch provided)

During the 3rd to the 6th centuries in the deserts of the Middle East, men and women, who became known as Desert Fathers and Mothers (Abbas and Ammas)

began a powerful movement to renounce the world and follow God's call. Christine Valtners Paintner writes, "The desert journey isn't about embarking on a long and arduous journey to find God at the end of the road. Desert spirituality is about looking for God right in the very midst of wrestling with ourselves. God is in the heart of the struggle, and we are to stay there with the Holy Presence until the treasure is revealed."

As a part of the self-examination we are encouraged to embark on in observance of a Holy Lent, this Lenten retreat will look at some of the teachings of the Ammas and Abbas, particularly what they call the passions (obstacles that keep us from loving God, ourselves and our neighbors) and the virtues (those things that invite us into healing and repentance as we look to deepen our awareness of God's presence and deep love for us).

CREATION CARE CORNER



"The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." (Psalm 24:1)

Caring for the environment is a Christian imperative. God, the creator, has entrusted us to be good stewards of the earth, to use its resources wisely, and to protect it for future generations. Yet, we pollute the air and water, we destroy animal habitats, and we significantly contribute to climate change.

Carbon, greenhouse gas, footprints...what does that mean? We have all heard the news about climate change and excess carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide, considered a "greenhouse gas" because it traps heat in the atmosphere, is in itself not a bad element. However, human activities are currently releasing more carbon dioxide than earth's natural processes can absorb. The amount of carbon dioxide added to our atmosphere annually has almost doubled since 1973 and is 200 times more than in 1850 due to the burning of fossil fuels for energy, industry, and travel. Coupled with a decrease in the way carbon is naturally absorbed (forests, tundra, sea grass, etc), the excess carbon dioxide has warmed the planet, sparking a whole host of destabilizing actions from extreme weather events to excessive droughts and rising sea levels.

We humans must acknowledge our actions and take active steps to reduce and offset our own carbon dioxide footprints and better care for the environment and our neighbors.

What's next? Our Creation Justice programs have helped parishioners learn more about water, air, and energy issues and what needs to be done to reverse the current crisis. Starting this February 6, we will be studying land use through a 10-week small group experience, "Sacred Land: Food and Farming." Through readings, conversation, prayer, and spiritual practices, participants will explore their relationships with land and examine practical ways to support sustainable food and farming practices. Please consider joining one of the Creation Justice's educational or action activities.

What is the Vestry?

The vestry is the elected lay leadership team (or executive team) at St. Michael's. The vestry is comprised of 9 individuals plus a Senior Warden, Junior Wardens, and Treasurer. The clergy also sit on the vestry but are non-voting members. The primary responsibility of the vestry is to oversee the finances and property of St. Michael's in addition to being ambassadors, liaisons for ministry, and helping with strategic decisions for the continued vitality of our spiritual home. Vestry members serve three-year terms while wardens may serve up to two years.

Special Voting Announcement: Active members of St. Michael's that are known to the treasurer are eligible to vote for vestry members. Electronic voting will be open January 29 and close on February 4 at 10:00 AM. Individuals attending in-person on February 4 may vote in-person with a paper ballot. One vote per member.
