

From the Rector

Dear People of God,

Earlier this year, a small figurine of Jesus greeted me when I went to read the Gospel from *The Saint John's Bible* during a Sunday service. No bigger than my thumb, Jesus was tucked into the spine-fold of Mark's Gospel. It was unexpected and wonders swirled around as to from where this little Jesus had come. Later in the service, during Communion, another little Jesus appeared on the altar rail. After the service, another was spotted on the thermostat. There were little Jesus sightings everywhere and before I knew it, people were passing Jesuses around like trading cards. In the weeks that followed, these little Jesuses continued to pop up in new and unexpected places, and they can still be spotted from time to time around the church.



It was a wonderful moment when I realized these little Jesuses weren't part of a Sunday School lesson for our children or youth. Nor were they an initiative thought up by our staff as part of a new program. Instead, a parishioner wanted to have a little fun and thought it would be a joyful way to have our community experience Jesus in a new way.

As I passed along little Jesuses, I found myself saying, "Here is a little Jesus," or "Do you need a little Jesus in your life?" Although tongue-in-cheek, having a little Jesus in our lives AND sharing Jesus with others is our call as Christians. As a community, we express this call to share Jesus as we live into our mission to make Christ known within and beyond our walls.

As we continue our journey through Lent, walk with Jesus through Holy Week, and stand outside the empty tomb on Easter, rest assured that Jesus will find you, especially when you least expect it. It could be in a familiar face or an unexpected place ... it may be in an overlooked detail or at the altar rail. We all need Jesus in our lives, and sometimes a little Jesus is more than enough.

Reimagining the Archangel Newsletter

As the clergy and staff continue to seek ways to be good stewards of the resources entrusted to our care, we've been reimagining the Archangel Newsletter. What you are holding is a work in progress, and we anticipate future adjustments as needed. Some of the realities are the impact this publication has on our natural resources and its carbon footprint. In the past four years as we have grown, we have doubled our mailing list, and it currently costs \$667 to print and mail 488 Archangel Newsletters. We also learned from the 2023 parish survey that this publication is not the primary source used to get involved or learn what is happening in our parish. As a result, you'll notice fewer pages and shorter descriptions. This is the final Archangel we will be mailing, unless you opt in to receive a printed and mailed copy. It is our hope that you will transition to viewing the Archangel digitally (on a computer or mobile device). The Well Reflection: Sunday School

God is like glitter. God's love is like glitter. Today I am a teacher, responsible for cleaning up after our children. I used to carry a picture in my mind where I am liberally sowing love like seed, a



dandelion gone gray, falling apart in places, carrying myself to my own lips as a wish to be borne on the slightest breeze, or in stillness, on my own trembling breath. But here I am, covered head to toe in glitter. It's on

my lashes, in my ears, somehow inside my clothes as I hand over a sparkling child into the arms of the parent who's come to retrieve it. . .And now I see it in their hair as well. It's everywhere, escaping dust cloth and broom, riotously, wildly free. How did it come to this? I was so careful, diligent, prepared, dispensing shining colors one by one.

There sits Jesus with the children as one of them reaches, grabs, overturns a lidless jar. Mounds of the stuff spill out, more, much more than the polite drop of glue waiting to receive a polite sprinkle of blue or purple or silver or gold could ever hope to hold. Every adult for miles around takes in a breath sharply, grabs a rag, finds a broom, scoops, sweeps, cleans with the urgency of firefighters leaning a ladder against a second-story nursery window. The child's eyes widen in dismay – until a hearty deep-throated laugh breaks the tension, and the two of them, Jesus and the child, are pouring color, laughing, stirring, mixing, cutting out construction paper hearts, smearing them with glue, using them to wipe the tables, and it's all laughter. The mother with the vacuum is trapped between laughing surrender and adult responsibility. Jesus catches her eye, captures her worry, and wordlessly says, "It's okay. There's plenty more." And sure enough, all the tubes are somehow still full, with 12 baskets leftover, and the child is still laughing. And the glitter? It will never be contained.

St. Michael's Journey to Becoming a Green Church

Early last year, St Michael's began a series of educational programs to help parishioners understand the roots and complexities of the climate crisis. Small groups have studied water, air, climate, energy, and food sourcing issues, and made recommendations to parish leadership on how St Mike's can reduce its carbon footprint. We are so pleased to highlight some of the results within and outside our walls.

Inside our walls...

- · Installation of LED bulbs throughout the campus (approximately 95% is now LED).
- · Installation of water bottle filling stations throughout the church to reduce single use plastic bottles.
- · Conversion to an electronic version of the Archangel, except when a hardcopy is requested.
- · Plans to experiment with non-plastic alternatives for our hospitality events, replacing countless plastic cups, forks, knives, spoons, etc.
- · Plans in conjunction with Earth Day in April to share ideas with our members re making a difference in their homes and communities.

Outside our walls...

- · We had almost 40 parishioners volunteer to help with the Great American Cleanup last year, picking up trash all around Prospect Lake.
- St. Michael's has adopted a portion of the Santa Fe trail, where volunteers pick up trash along the trail multiple times each month.

Please participate, as you are able, in these and upcoming efforts to improve our care for God's Creation as we move to becoming a "Green Church".

Planet or Plastic?

You've probably heard that question before. It is very real and very present. "Planet or plastic?" is National Geographic's multiyear effort to raise awareness about the global plastic trash crisis.

Plastic's remarkable durability, which makes it so useful, is its very downfall for the environment. Unlike natural materials, it degrades incredibly slowly, taking hundreds of years to break down. 40% of plastics wind up in landfills and 32% wind up uncontained in the environment. Only 14% is recycled, while another 14% is incinerated. Yet, even after breakdown, it lives on as tiny fragments called microplastics.

These microplastics are polluting our oceans – harming marine life all along the food chain. They've been found in the high mountain snowpacks potentially impacting not only marine life but also our drinking water. Landfills are overflowing with plastic, likely leaching harmful chemicals into the soil and water. In addition, plastic production relies on fossil fuels, which contribute to greenhouse gas emissions and climate change.

Microplastics are now known to enter our bodies through our food and water. Plastic's wide use in food production, processing, packaging, and distribution leads to the release of microplastics that mix with our food and drinks. Recent studies have found microplastics in human organs and bloodstreams.

Plastic's harm to God's Creation, our home, is undeniable and demands efforts to reduce our usage.

So, what can we do? Opt out of plastics, as you can. Buy aluminum or glass beverage containers, not plastic. Use glass storage containers, not plastic. Don't reach for that plastic water bottle; use a refillable one instead. Increase your use of biodegradable materials and recycle or reuse the plastic you must use.

Family Promise provides case management and enrichment classes that empower families on their road to housing stability. Featured Partner: Westside CARES

Did you know that Westside CARES is a major financial contributor to St. Mike's Laundry Love Ministry? Conveniently located near our Laundry Love laundromat in Old Colorado City, many of our Laundry Love neighbors visit Westside CARES while their clothes are being washed. The organization is a nonprofit collaboration of 22 interfaith communities in El Paso County, united in care and compassion for those in need by providing crisis human services. The only criteria for accessing services is an individual's or family's genuine need.

In 2022, Westside CARES provided rental assistance to 528 families to help them avoid eviction; 26,036 four-day healthy food baskets to local families and individuals in need; helped 576 neighbors obtain vital documents, like IDs and birth certificates; transportation assistance to 1,808 individuals; eye exams and glasses for 108 people; back-to-school backpacks to 600 people; 449 nurse consultations; 36 prescriptions; clothing from the onsite resource room to 2,026 people; holiday or Thanksgiving help to 160 families; housing navigation for 300 people; mail support for 1,000 neighbors; and over 10,000 snack bags.
