FROM THE RECTOR



Dear People of God,

During this season of abundance, the table is set but something might be missing. Life can seem so full and empty at the same time. Our calendars are filled with obligations, there aren't enough hours in the day, and the pressure can be overwhelming at times. The table is set, but the empty plate illuminates all the things out of our control. The seduction of scarcity reminds us something is missing. But what if the empty plate in our life calls us to hope, accept, and love like Jesus loved?

With the *most wonderful time* of the year upon us, I'm mindful of the competing forces many of us will

experience this Thanksgiving and Christmas. For some of us there will be celebrations, merriment, and joyfulness - while others will experience worry, anxiety, and sorrow - but for many I anticipate there will be a holy cocktail of numerous competing emotions. And then ... before we know it, January will be here, we'll pack up the decorations, and we'll do it all over again next year.

However, what if this Thanksgiving and Christmas we set an extra empty plate and load up the plate with all the things we could hope for and all the things we need to accept? Before we know it, our plates would be filled with the imperfect pieces of our life, the things that break our hearts, and it would require us to live a little more like Jesus. In other words, how can we use this time to be honest with God and ourself, instead of our faith being an afterthought or side dish?

As followers of Christ, we live out our faith through outward and visible signs as well as inward and invisible practices. The exterior and interior things we do are a principle hallmark of our Christian journey. In the Bible we encounter story after story of the outward and inward spiritual practices of Jesus. From Jesus performing miracles in front of curious onlookers to retreating to a secluded place to pray, Jesus' ministry mirrored this outward and inward approach. The power of this approach is evident in the ways that Jesus transformed the disciples' empty plates.

As we experience the fullness of the empty plates in our lives in the coming months, I'm looking forward to seeing how we can be *Led by the Spirit,* fill some empty plates, and feast on the bounty of God's love in our lives.




THE WELL
