

The Lessons

Isaiah 61: 1-9

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. Strangers shall stand and feed your flocks, foreigners shall till your land and dress your vines; but you shall be called priests of the Lord, you shall be named ministers of our God; you shall enjoy the wealth of the nations,

and in their riches you shall glory.

Because their shame was double,
and dishonor was proclaimed as their lot,
therefore they shall possess a double portion;
everlasting joy shall be theirs.

For I the Lord love justice,
I hate robbery and wrongdoing;
I will faithfully give them their recompense,
and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are

many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

(Candidates for Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation please stand, as able)

Bishop to Candidates: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?

Candidates: I do.

Bishop: Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Candidates: I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.

Bishop to Congregation: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in

their life in Christ?

People boldly say: We will.

Bishop: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our

own baptismal covenant.

(All please stand, as able)

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

human being?

Prayers for the Candidates

The Bishop then says to the congregation

Leader: Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Send them into the world in witness to your love.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Bishop: Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ

you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and

reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

For Confirmation

The Bishop lays hands upon each one and says

Strengthen, O Lord, your servant N. with your Holy Spirit; empower *them* for your service; and sustain *them* all the days of *their* life. (Congregations boldly say) Amen.

or this

Defend, O Lord, your servant N. with your heavenly grace, that *they* may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more, until *they* come to your everlasting kingdom. (Congregations boldly say) Amen.

For Reception

N., we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion.

God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. (Congregations boldly say) Amen.

For Reaffirmation

N., may the Holy Spirit, who has begun a good work in you, direct and uphold you in the service of Christ and his kingdom. (Congregations boldly say) Amen.

The Bishop concludes with this prayer



About the service

Through the sacrament of Baptism, we are made full members in the Body of Christ, and in it we are sealed and confirmed as Christ's own forever. Confirmation is the Rite of Re-affirmation of one's Baptismal vows made in the context of the faith community that includes the laying on of hands by a bishop. Candidates for Confirmation are presented and asked to reaffirm their renunciation of evil and a renewal of their commitment to Jesus Christ. The responses of a candidate is a representation of the continuing work of the Holy Spirit in their life and their connection to the wider apostolic community.

The act of reaffirmation is an acknowledgment that an individual is an ambassador for Christ, having found new meaning, empowerment, healing or transformation in faith. Those witnessing these promises agree to support those who are recommitting themselves to their life in Christ. Preceding and following such a reaffirmation (whether Confirmation, Reception from another denomination into the Episcopal Church, or one's Reaffirmation years after one's Confirmation), candidates acknowledge the ongoing, faith-forming education for discipleship, service and mission, and understanding that all Christians continue their journey of faith within the context of a supportive faith community.
