Lent bags are free of charge and a gift from your spiritual home.

Included in your Lent-to-Go bag is enough pancake mix for 12-14 pancakes. If you are feeding more than two people, let us know and we will provide you with an extra pancake mix container and syrups. Included in your bag are two Soup Bowls (which also make great mugs). If you would like more than 2 soup bowls there is a \$5 fee per extra soup bowl. When you come to pick up your bag please let one of our volunteers you would like to purchase one (or more) extra soup bowls.


Shrove Tuesday Online

Ash Wednesday Service February 17, 6:00 PM

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40 day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, and reflection. The 40-day period represents the time of temptation Jesus experienced in the wilderness before his ministry began.

This Ash Wednesday, following Diocesan guidelines and physical distancing measures, a member of the clergy is unable to impose ashes on your forehead. However, in the Lent-to-Go bag you will find a small

container of blessed ashes that can be used to mark your own forehead and others in your home. Included in your Lent-to-Go bag are also prayers that you can say before, during, and after you place ashes on the forehead. *During the 6:00 PM online Ash Wednesday Service there will be a time that you can impose ashes on yourself.* Links to watch the online service and download the bulletin will be on the our homepage **www.stmikeschurch.com.**

United Thank Offering (UTO) Boxes are Back!



The United Thank Offering (UTO) is a ministry of the Episcopal Church for the mission of the whole church.

Through UTO, individuals are invited to embrace and deepen a personal daily spiritual discipline of gratitude. UTO encourages people to notice the good things that happen each day, give thanks to God for those blessings, and make an offering for each blessing using a UTO Blue Box.

Some of the things that UTO funds include: kitchen equipment for homeless shelters, handicap access in church and service buildings, a school in the Dominican Republic, family counseling, a dental clinic for the poor, after-school programs, a library for a seminary in Africa, and playgrounds for child-care centers. Put some coins or dollars into a UTO Blue Box with thanksgiving, prayer, and generosity, or set aside an offering reminder for later so we can take blessings out to expand the church's faithfulness to God's mission. We have a tub outside the church office door where you can drop your donations of these items any time. Our guests are so excited to receive a



New AVL (Audio-Video-Lighting) System is installed!





During the summer of 2020 St. Michael's embarked on an ambitious project to install a new state-of-the-art AVL System inside the church. In less than a month we raised over \$75,000 from over 120 families. It was amazing to see how quickly our community came together to fund this critical project to help us stay connected beyond our walls. Unfortunately, the pandemic slowed the production of several necessary pieces of equipment and the waiting game began. After months of waiting, the new system was finally installed and on January 10, 2021 we used the new AVL system for the first time. The results were stunning and the feedback was tremendous. Over the past several weeks we've been training new volunteers to operate the equipment and we've been working hard to enhance your worship experience. Thank you to all who have helped to make this project a success and come to fruition.


