

Boulder Fire Response

St. Michael's & Chapel of our Saviour Episcopal Churches in Colorado Springs are partnering together to respond to the devastating fires that destroyed nearly 1,000 homes in Boulder. Dreams were burnt to the ground, cars were destroyed, priceless family treasures were lost forever, and most escaped with just the clothes on their back. The response from federal, state, and local agencies has been swift but there are still significant gaps for the everyday needs of those impacted.

A long time member of St. Michael's has a daughter and grandchildren that live in Louisville and sadly lost everything. St. Michael's was able to send her some financial help and within minutes she responded with the following message, "We are in awe of St. Michael's generosity and thoughtfulness. You all have warmed our hearts during a very dark time. We thank you from the bottom of our heart"

Organ Update

During the months of January, February, and March you'll notice something missing on Sundays ... our beautiful organ. The current organ control system was in need of a major upgrade. The original organ, installed in 2004, has been running on Windows 98 and over the years critical components have stopped working. After a year of research we have hired John Grunow to upgrade our control system to a state-of-the-art Opus 2 system. 
