In preparation for the 2023 Annual Meeting the Vestry has adopted new Bylaws to allow two Junior Wardens. The term limits for wardens have been updated to allow a 2-year-term limit. The updated bylaws have been posted on the website per the Canons: www.stmikeschurch.com/annualmeeting. In addition, the Vestry has adopted a 2023 budget which will be shared during the annual meeting. The Annual Meeting will be held in the church and will also be livestreamed.

**Special Voting Announcement:** Active members of St. Michael's that are known to the treasurer are eligible to vote for vestry members. Electronic voting will be open January 23 and close on January 29 at 10:00 AM. Individuals attending in-person on January 29 may vote in-person with a paper ballot. One vote per member. #### What is the Vestry?

The vestry is the elected lay leadership team (or executive team) at St. Michael's. The vestry is comprised of 9 individuals plus a Senior Warden, Junior Wardens, and Treasurer. The clergy also sit on the vestry but are non-voting members. The primary responsibility of the vestry is to oversee the finances and property of St. Michael's in addition to being ambassadors, liaisons for ministry, and helping with strategic decisions for the continued vitality of our spiritual home. Vestry members serve three-year terms while wardens may serve up to two years.

# Sacred Water CARE OF CREATION

In recent decades the Episcopal Church has invited congregations to adopt a *Care of Creation* which is a commitment to practicing loving formation, liberating advocacy, and life-giving conversations as individuals, congregations, and dioceses around the earth and it's resources. In recent years St. Michael's has been prayerfully discerning how we can be better stewards of the earth and our resources. Since 2020 we have converted 90% of the light



fixtures in the building to LED and recently upgraded all our thermostats to be more energy friendly. We've installed more drip lines with our irrigation system, repaired leaks, and have less than 1,200 square feet of manicured grass. However, the call to do more is knocking on our door.

Water is central to both our Christian theology and to our survival. Each week we pray for God's earth and all who call it home. We pray for those who need rain and those who have too much rain. In recent months we have formed a "Creation Team" at St. Michael's with individuals committed to eco-justice. Our Creation team has been trained to facilitate the JustFaith Program of "Sacred Water: Oceans & Ecosystems." Sacred Water is a small group experience that will guide participants in discerning how they can better care for the earth's waters. Through prayer and spiritual practices, participants will explore their relationships with water in both Christian Scriptures and their daily lives. Participants can expect to leave Sacred Water better equipped to restore the health of our oceans, waterways, and ecosystems through advocacy, grassroots organizing, and daily decision-making. #### Partner Organization: A Precious Child, Boulder "Christmas Extravaganza"

After the Marshall Fire in December 2021, St. Michael's distributed nearly \$20,000 that we collected from parishioners. The remaining \$8,600 was delivered by Rev. Angela to 'A Precious Child' which funded a "Christmas Extravaganza" that provided Christmas trees, gifts, and essentials to over 700 victims who are still rebuilding their lives a year after the fire.





# Partner Organizations: Mercy's Gate, St. Andrew's Episcopal **Church, and D20 Schools Family Resource Center Light Festival Food Pantry Donations**

Inviting Light Festival guests to bring a few canned goods yielded several thousand pounds of food donations. Wow! We filled four vehicles with food that was delivered to three different partner organizations around the city. After the Light Festival we had several generous parishioners bring even more food on Sunday. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

## **Partner Organizations: Partners in Housing Light Festival Toy Donations**

Guests who attended our Light Festival could bring canned goods or a new toy. This allows guests to decide what kind of generosity they wanted to pass along. It was wonderful to see how many toys were donated (including 3 brand new bicycles - with helmets). In total we collected over 200 toys that were donated to Partners in Housing the week before Christmas.





St. Michael's Laundry Love ministry is dedicated to washing clothes and bedding for low/no income people in West Colorado Springs with love, dignity, and detergent. In 2022 Deacon Gary and our volunteers worked 52 days, served 2,361 guests, washed and dried 6,398 loads of laundry, and spent \$13,975 in donations, partner grants, and the generosity of St. Michael's parishioners. 
# **Youth Council Monthly on Sundays** January 22 & February 26

Registration Now Open!



# **Light for the Journey**


**Thursdays, January 12 (6-weeks) 6:30 - 8:00 PM**
