From the Rector

Dear People of God,


Growing up, my summers were spent catching fireflies in mason jars, staying up past my bedtime, and attending Vacation Bible School. The break from school provided an opportunity to reset, grow a few inches, splash in the pool, and make new memories. As an adult, I still stay up past my bedtime but enjoy new things about the summer months. I am grateful for days filled with more sunshine for bigger adventures, blooming flowers, the smell of hamburgers cooking on the grill, and the beautiful sunsets I enjoy watching from our backyard.

The invitations that summer brings into our lives are as numerous as what we may enjoy (or dislike) about the warmer summer months. The most obvious invitation is the opportunity to enjoy a new rhythm. This can be exciting for many, but if you like your routine, summer can be another obstacle you have to wait out until you can return to a more comfortable cadence.

Earlier this year one of my long-time Spiritual Directors, The Most Rt. Rev. Frank Griswold, died. As one of the former Presiding Bishops of The Episcopal Church, Frank was a deep thinker with a gentle heart that was only outmatched by his infectious faith and love of God. We worked together for years and he always provided me with the most helpful insights when it came to my prayer life, my call to be a priest, and the ways to deepen my relationship with God. Towards the end of one of our sessions Frank said, **“There is an invitation in everything. Finding that invitation is the goal.”** I commended these simple words to memory and have found great joy and transformation in applying this reminder to nearly every aspect of my life.

In reflecting on how I spend my time as the Rector of St. Michael’s, I’m confident that discovering the invitation that accompanies the challenges of (fill in the blank) is what I am called to do. Thankfully for all of us, spending time responding to these challenges and *finding the invitation* brings me energy and great hopefulness about what God is doing at St. Michael’s.

As you reflect on the invitations that seek you out this summer and the invitations God may place on your heart, I pray that you find new opportunities to use your gifts, listen for the ways God is whispering into your life and approach the invitations you receive as a Holy summons to be led by the Spirit.

Did you know a Creation Care Team comprised of individuals committed to eco-justice was recently formed at St. Michael's?

The team has already participated in one small group experience, "Sacred Water: Oceans and Ecosystems," that helped educate them about the disparities in the control and availability of the Earth's waters and discern how to better care for this precious resource. The next 10-week small group experience, "Sacred Air: Climate and Energy," will begin on September 26. Through prayer and spiritual practices, participants will explore their relationships with air in both Christian scriptures and their daily lives. Am I wasting water? A leaky toilet can waste anywhere from a few gallons to hundreds each day! A simple way to test your toilet is to place around 20 drops of food coloring into the tank on the back of your toilet. Then observe the water in the bowl. If the food coloring creeps into the bowl, you have a leak somewhere that needs to be addressed! Fixing the leak will not only prevent wasting a precious resource, but also save on your water bill.

The Questions of Ordinary Times

We've heard the grand stories in the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. Now we are in Ordinary Times, that long liturgical season of those seemingly endless Sundays after Pentecost, where we are invited to consider what it all means for our current lives? How are we supposed to live in the light of the grand stories and life of Jesus? What does it mean in our lives – right here, right now? For example, how do we live the commandment to love one another? What does love look like in our bank accounts? What does it look like in our relationships with family, partners, children, and friends? Perhaps especially, how do we love those whom we don't like or those who are different from us? What does love look like in our work, in our votes, in our service? These are some of the challenges of Ordinary Times. This is a season in which, with prayer, discernment and perhaps working with a spiritual director, we can notice and reflect upon how we respond: how we do and how we might live into these questions.

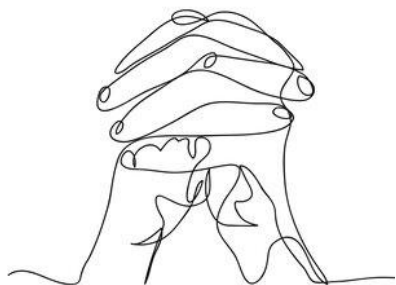

Cookie & Bread Ministries

Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEVs)

The purpose of the Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEV) ministry is to ensure that members of the parish who are either temporarily or permanently unable to regularly attend Sunday services receive the Eucharist. LEVs are trained by Episcopal Deacons, licensed by the Diocese, and commissioned by our home parish. By having lay people provide this ministry, members are able to receive communion more frequently than if only the priests were able to do this. The LEV sending prayer at the conclusion of our Sunday services makes it clear that not only the priest, but also the congregation, are sending the LEVs out for the visitation. Members needing a LEV may self-refer or be referred by a Care team, clergy, or other parishioner. St. Michael's currently has twelve active members of the LEV ministry, organized into teams, who take communion to seven parishioners on a regular basis.
