FROM THE RECTOR



Dear Friends,

With the season of Lent upon us, I'm looking forward to the many ways we will be exploring the gifts in our life and community - both the gifts we recognize and those hidden in plain sight. As a cradle Episcopalian (*someone who was born and raised in the Episcopal Church*) the idea of giving up something for Lent has been commonplace in my life. I've been surrounded by people who have given up chocolate, meat, coffee, or sweets during the 40 days of Lent.

As a teenager I was intrigued to learn two things about Lent that I've continued to ponder over the years. First, Sundays are considered feast days during Lent and do not count in the

40 days. Therefore, one could indulge on Sundays with boxes of chocolate and gallons of coffee without guilt or shame. While indulging once a week is technically possible, it can lessen the impact of a true fast. The second focus of lent that stuck with me was that one is to give up something during Lent to grow closer to God. Growing up this often raised the question, "How does giving up chocolate deepen your relationship with God?"

As a young adult, I was introduced to the idea of adding something into your life during the season Lent to help one grow spiritually. The concept of adding something resonated because it was easy to see how adding prayer, a Bible study, or a routine of worship could in fact deepen your relationship with God. Over the past several years loss has been a big part of our lives, so I continue to encourage the people of St. Michael's to add something into their life during the season of Lent. This year, we will be focusing on our gifts and one such gift in our community this season is The Saint John's Bible.

The Saint John's Bible is the first illuminated hand written Bible in English that has been produced in over 500 years. It took six artists and six calligraphers over 11 years to complete the project and I'm thrilled we have the Gospel and Acts volume on loan for the next several months. With over 20 trained docents in our community we will have numerous opportunities to share The Saint John's Bible within and beyond our walls. Join me on Wednesdays for the Lenten Soup Suppers and catch a glimpse of the Bible on Sundays during or after our morning services. During this season of Lent, as we joyfully anticipate the empty tomb, I pray you experience the power of Lent and the gift that it can be. See you on Sunday!

Spiritual Gifts 201 - March 12, 9:15 AM "Gifts in the Bible"





The Gift of Lent: Deepening our Intimacy with God

We have an inherent longing for closeness to God, but it can sometimes be hard to realize how much God longs for closeness with us in return. If we see God as a distant authority figure, our image may need some updating. God yearns for our presence so deeply that we can have trouble absorbing the beams of light that characterize this great love. When we sit down to pray, God has probably initiated the call to spend time with Him in a very personal way. He reaches out to each of us, not with a demand, but with a holy invitation to be a friend in a vibrant relationship. Think about the gifts our closest friends give us-comfort when we are sick or grieving, laughter during play, feedback when we need it, celebrating on special occasions, and above all, listening from the heart when we need to bear our souls. God is certainly present in the love of our friends but also reaches out to us personally with gifts of mercy, forgiveness, moments of awe, and love for us exactly as we are, warts and all. How can we walk this path of intimacy with God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit? One way is to cultivate the practice of centering prayer, often called prayer from the heart. Centering prayer is like sitting down with a close friend and just being together with no need to talk. We sit with God in silence and listen. What a gift it could be during Lent to spend 20 minutes a day knowing that God is closer than our very breath. Thought interruptions will come up but can be welcomed as opportunities to dismiss them with a sacred word such as "God" or "love" and sink again into a deep connection with God. (To learn more, read The Heart of Centering Prayer by Cynthia Bourgeault.) May the gift of Lent this year awaken us to how deeply God desires our friendship and how we can build intimacy in this Holy relationship. How awesome is that!

2023 Outreach Grants

What is an Outreach Grant? A financial gift from St. Michael's to an Outreach Partner or initiative that supports relief efforts, rehabilitation, or development beyond our walls.

Where does the money come from? Each year St. Michael's Vestry approves a budget that allows our clergy, staff, and lay leaders to carry out the mission of our church. When the vestry approved the 2023 budget for the church \$30,000 was given to the Outreach Committee to make a difference beyond our walls. \$29,000 was set aside for grants and \$1,000 for administrative costs for support our Outreach ministries. Because of your generosity we've been able to increase the Outreach Grants from \$20,000 in 2020 to \$30,000 in 2023.

Who is on the Outreach Committee? St. Michael's Outreach Committee consists of parishioners that are liaisons between St. Michael's and our numerous Outreach Partners in the community. Susan Futey is the Outreach Chair, Andy Laffely is the Vestry Liaison, and there are several "at-large" members, along with Deacon Gary.
