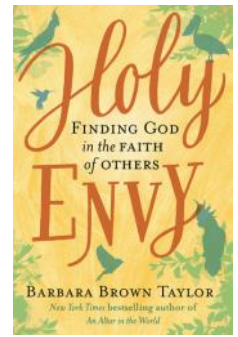

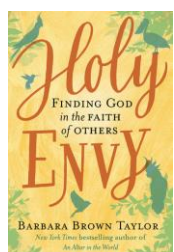

65th Anniversary Celebration

Our humble beginnings ...

The Chapel of St. Michael the Archangel was established in 1957 under the sponsorship of Grace and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, located on Tejon Street. The Rector conceived an expansion of the Episcopal Church in Colorado Springs. This resulted in the creation of three chapels in the East, South, and North areas of the city. These chapels were started and supported until such time as they were able to become self sustaining. St. Michael's was the last of the chapels established in September 1957. St. Michael's first worship service was held in a storefront on North Nevada Avenue. Two years later (1959) the growing congregation moved to Burgess Road in the Black Forest, where a wooden A-frame chapel was built. When a fire destroyed the chapel, services were held on the Air Force Academy grounds. Property on Tudor Road was then purchased for a new church building. The church was built in June 1962; a rectory followed shortly thereafter. In May of 1966, The Church of Saint Michael the Archangel achieved full parish status. The Rev. Richard Palmer became the first rector in 1967. In the late 1960s, St. Andrew's Hall, a library, nursery, and parish offices were added. In 1996, the size of the facility was greatly increased with a new nave, gathering area, nursery, bathrooms, a kitchen, Sunday school rooms, and meeting rooms. The organ was completed and dedicated in 2004 and extensive landscaping in the rear of the church took place in 2005 to add the columbarium, a memorial plaza, and gardens.

As we celebrate our 65th year, St. Michael's has never been stronger and we are currently one of the fastest growing Episcopal Churches in the state. While the pandemic of 2020 forced many churches to make difficult decisions, the strength and faithfulness of the people of St. Michael's helped us thrive. As we prepare for the next 65 years of making Christ known within and beyond our walls, we are ready to celebrate! As we give thanks for the past, live into the present, and look ahead to the future, we hope you join us for several events as we mark this

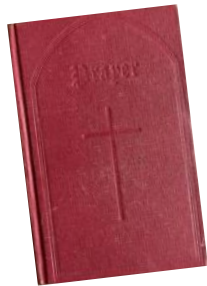

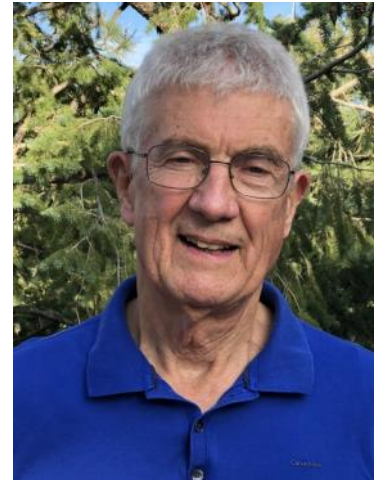

Outreach

Outreach Fall Spotlight Partner Partners in Housing

St. Michael's has been supporting the homeless families in Partners in Housing (PIH) for many years. We are excited to do this because PIH has a strong track record for helping homeless families reach self-sufficiency and secure housing. In 2021-2022, 92% of the families in their one-year transitional housing program achieved stable housing. In 2022, volunteers from St. Michael's supported the children of these homeless families by delivering snacks to PIH's Child Enrichment Center (CEC) at The Colorado House or by donating money to PIH's Colorado House Food Pantry. In addition, St. Michael's Outreach Committee has supported PIH in several ways:

1. Donated \$1,000 in late 2021 to the PIH Flat Tire Fund to help repair cars, so parents can get to work.
2. Donated food and supplies collected through the 40 Days of Giving Drive.
3. Collected a generous supply of backpacks and school supplies for the 68 families served by PIH.
4. Granted PIH \$2,000 to support the needs of these homeless families. Thank you, St. Michael's!
