ALL PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Common Cup

On Sunday, September 3, we will reintroduce the Common Cup during the Eucharist for parishioners to decide if they would like to take a small sip of wine from the chalice, dip (intinct) the wafer into the chalice, or opt to abstain from receiving wine. In the Episcopal tradition, all persons may, but no one must, receive communion in both kinds to realize the full spiritual benefits of communion. The Eucharistic doctrine of concomitance affirms the simultaneous presence of Christ's body and blood in each of the eucharistic elements.

Reintroducing the Common Cup for sipping or dipping is a return to the practice we observed as a community prior to the pandemic. We have made this decision based on what we now know about the pandemic, the scientific studies that have been conducted



on sharing a chalice, and Bishop Kym Lucas' request for all churches to offer the Common Cup. However, we recognize there still may be mixed feelings about this. In the weeks ahead as you come forward to receive Communion, you are encouraged to lean into the practice with which you are most comfortable. If you decide to take a sip of wine from the chalice, please help guide the chalice to your mouth. We will be experimenting with adding two additional chalice bearers for some services which we expect will help with the traffic flow at the altar rail and keep the service running smoothly.

Well Imagining Team Reflection

This summer I had the pleasure of accompanying three St. Mike's high schoolers, and 20 total high schoolers from the Diocese of Colorado to the Episcopal Youth Event. This celebration happens once every three years and is a conference for Episcopal high schoolers from around the world to come together, learn together, worship together, and think deeply about the future of the church. Rarely have I felt so much energy and life at a church gathering. We often obsess over this idea that "the church is dying." As someone who has the



privilege of spending large amounts of time with children, youth, and young adults, I'm not sure I buy into this idea. Are churches closing? Sure. Are priests retiring? Sure. Are numbers of identified Episcopalians shrinking? Sure. But, as I worshipped with 1,200 high schoolers from all over the world this summer, I sure didn't have any sense of death. As we danced, and praised, and sang, and loved, the Spirit was alive. So maybe what is happening is that some of the ways we've done church for the past hundred years are dying. The church is changing, and our young people are making it theirs. Let's help them.

CREATION JUSTICE & OUTREACH



As Christians, we are called to love the world God loves. God's love proclaimed in the bible includes all creation in its work of salvation, redemption, and holiness. Looking at our world today, it is clear that our environment is suffering along with many of the people who live in it. Communities around the world struggle with water issues – too much, too little, and widespread contamination – including many places in Colorado. The air that envelops our planet is choking with materials that are harmful to us and our earthly home. Temperatures are rising and climate is changing.

In loving our world, we must commit to form and restore loving, liberating, lifegiving relationships with all of Creation. We need to stand alongside

marginalized, vulnerable peoples. Our habits of environmental destruction call for spiritual renewal. We must attend to the call of our faith and the needs of God's creation.

How do we make this happen? We can adopt practical ways of reducing our climate impact and living more humbly and gently on Earth as individuals, households, congregations, institutions, and dioceses. By doing so, we protect our neighbors and communities and ensure a prosperous, just, and secure future for all.

PARISH SURVEY RESULTS

We are so grateful to the 135 households who took the time to complete the Spring 2023 parish survey. Interestingly, roughly half of the respondents have been members of St. Michael's for ten or more years and half for nine or less, with 13% being members for less than a year. The key message echoed throughout, as indicated by the Word Cloud below (where the bigger, bolder a word is, the more often it was mentioned), was that St. Mike's is WELCOMING. Close behind in frequency were the words HOME, CARING, VIBRANT, INCLUSIVE, and LOVING. The clergy, staff, and vestry will continue to use the survey results to make decisions and discern how we can best live into our mission.

- 91% of the survey participants indicated that St. Mike's is considerably contributing to their growth or deepening their relationship with God, the world, their neighbors, and themselves.
- 87% of survey participants expressed high confidence that they would receive a supportive response from clergy if they reached out.
- Only 7% of respondents worship primarily online, but 84% indicated they use online options for some form of worship or programming.
